Naut'sa mawt Event Management at IMPAC 5

The IMPAC5 Congress was hosted in Vancouver this February 3rd-9th by the International Marine Protected Areas Congress. Our Events team collaborated with our Marketing Department to design and develop the Indigenous Pavilion, a stunning display highlighting Indigenous accomplishments in ocean conservation and Coast Salish art and culture. Our events team was also responsible for the Indigenous full-day Caucus Meeting, and Indigenous lounge and networking space, and the Indigenous Banquet. Over 3000 local and international visitors attended.

Pink Shirt Day

Naut'sa mawt Resources Group and WITS Foundation have partnered for the sale and production of Pink Shirts for Pink Shirt Day. All Member Nations have been offered complementary shirts, featuring the artwork of Koyah Morgan-Banke from Toquaht and Secwepemc First Nation. Proceeds from the sale of the shirts and hoodies will be distributed between WITS foundation and Naut'sa mawt.
