The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) has been the national voice of municipal government since 1901. FCM's members include more than 2,000 municipalities of all sizes, from Canada's cities and rural communities, to northern communities and 20 provincial and territorial municipal associations. Together, they represent more than 90 percent of all Canadians from coast to coast to coast. Municipal leaders from across Canada assemble each year to set FCM policy on key issues Canadian municipalities came together in 1901 as the Union of Canadian Municipalities (UCM). The Dominion Conference of Mayors was established in 1935 and by 1937 the two national bodies joined as the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities—renamed the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) in 1976. Today, FCM advocates for municipalities to be sure their citizens' needs are reflected in federal policies and programs. Year after year, FCM's work benefits every municipal government and taxpayer in Canada, and our programming delivers tools that help municipalities tackle local challenges.

Asset Management BC (AMBC) is the greater community of any person, organization or agency engaged in, or has an interest in, asset management. Asset Management BC is governed by a Partnership Committee, comprised of 9 partners: Union of BC Municipalities,



Local Government Management Association of BC, BC Water and Waste Association, Municipal Insurance Association of BC, Government Finance Officers Association of BC, Planning Institute of BC, Public Works Association of BC, CivicInfo BC and the BC Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing. The Partnership Committee is supported by a 'Community of Practice Working Group' that provides input and advice on strategic direction. The Community of Practice Working Group is made up of a group of associations, local governments, first nations representatives and Partnership Committee members, brought together to recognize and integrate the political, administrative, technical, operational, financial and planning aspects of asset management.

The formation of Asset Management BC involved broad consultation and discussion with a wide selection of stakeholders parties including local governments, professional associations, private and academic sectors. From those broad consultations, Asset Management BC was established.

In 1966, municipal leaders from Yellowknife, Fort Smith, Hay River and Inuvik met to form an association representing the NWT's community governments. The Northwest Territories Association of Communities (NWTAC) was created to "promote the exchange of information among the community governments of the Northwest Territories and to provide a united front for the realization of goals." All 33 of the NWT's incorporated communities are members of the NWTAC. Together, we have become a powerful, effective voice for NWT community governments. Acting on our democratically adopted resolutions, we advocate for the interests of NWT communities to the Governments of Canada and the Northwest Territories, and through the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM). The NWTAC was known as the NWT Association of Municipalities until the creation of Nunavut in 1999. We are a not-for-profit society registered in the Northwest Territories and governed by the NWTAC Bylaws.
